⚠ Your Safety Matters **⚠**

Personal Safety: Most accidents are caused by carelessness or thoughtlessness--yours, or someone else's. When an accident occurs, it is because someone has failed to foresee that it could happen. Identify possible hazards and plan how to avoid them. Equpiment Safety: Before you climb aboard a piece of heavy equipment, walk completely around it and observe any persons or obstacles in the vicinity. Warn anyone nearby that you are getting ready to move the equipment. Site Safety: Be aware of the "Big 4" construction hazards: Falls, Caught-In or -Between, Struck-By, and Electrocution.

Caught-in or -Between:

- 1. Accidents where workers are pinned or caught between machinery or fixed structures often happen suddenly and without warning. 2. Machinery that has unguarded moving parts when in use or not locked out when conducting maintenance is a common contributor to caught-in or -between hazards.
 - 3. Feed bins and high walls where engulfment is possible are all hazards to identify before work begins.
 - 4. Never position yourself between moving and fixed objects.
